NJSHAD User: Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) Center of New Jersey

NJSHAD Tool: Used "Birth Query" to identify which NJ communities have high-risk populations. NJSHAD birth query tool provides data on births by birth weight, duration of pregnancy, onset of prenatal care, race, ethnicity, county, and municipality.

NJSHAD User: Statewide Parent Advocacy Network (SPAN), Inc.

NJSHAD Tool: Used NJSHAD to obtain information for a successful grant application. NJSHAD provided data on percent of NJ kids living in poverty; infant and fetal death rates; maternal health, smoking, nutrition, and obesity by community and demographic group.

NJSHAD is a collaborative effort involving multiple offices and divisions in the NJ Department of Health.

HEALTH INDICATOR REPORTS

Show the public health status of a population for a given health issue.

- Over 200 reports available
- ⇒ Explain importance of health indicator
- Provide current status of indicator
- What is being done to improve it
- Graphs and tables of key statistics

COMMUNITY PROFILES

Provide access to a set of health indicators for a selected community.

- ⇒ Available for all 21 NJ counties and the 4 largest racial/ethnic groups
- Community statistics are compared to those of NJ and the US
- ⇒ Example: Compare low birth weight, preterm, and infant mortality rates for your county to the rates for the whole state and the U.S.
